

INFLATABLE SAFETY AGREEMENT

- 1. Adult supervision is required at all times. Never leave the inflatable unattended or unwatched. Serious injury or death may occur if an inflatable is left unattended.
- 2. Customers are responsible for checking the weather forecast before use. All About That Bounce recommends using weather.com or intellicast.com. These websites offer doppler radar to view the day's weather. The customer must always pay attention to the changes of the weather. If it begins to rain or the wind speed increases beyond a safe level, remove all participants, and shut down the equipment by turning off the blower(s) and removing the power source. The blowers should be disconnected from the power source to prevent damage from a lightening strike, and the deflated bounce house should be covered by a tarp. All About That Bounce inflatables are not permitted to be used in rain or lightening conditions.
- 3. Customer shall do a quick and final safety check of unit before use. This can help discover any potential problems with the unit. Customers shall inspect the rood support columns, pillars, steps, and mattress for unsafe conditions. If any unsafe condition is discovered to include but not limited to a failing seam, hole, or rip all occupants must be removed immediately and the unit should be shut down for a more detailed safety check.
- 4. For safety, children of different sizes should not bounce at the same time. Customers should read the manufacturer's information plate carefully. Never let the total weight of the participants exceed the weight limit of the unit.
- 5. All persons must remove shoes, pocket items, glasses, jewelry, etc. before entering an inflatable.
- 6. No pushing, roughhousing, tumbling/somersaults, wrestling flips, or general horseplay, and stay away from the entrance, exit, sides, and walls. No jumping/climbing the walls. If using with a slide, do not slide headfirst. Only one person on the slide at a time.
- 7. No food, drink, utensils, or gum on the inflatable. NO SILLY STRING in, on, or near the inflatable.
- 8. Inflatables should not be operated if winds exceed 15 mph.

- 9. Keep children away from the inflatable blower(s) and extension cord(s). If the blower malfunctions, stop use immediately. If inflatable begins to lose air, occupants should exit inflatable immediately.
